## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Warm greetings to the Sacred Heart Girls' Family



On Wednesday the 19<sup>th</sup> May, the communities of 240 Catholic Schools throughout New Zealand celebrated Catholic School's Day with the theme "Be the change" – a rallying call which focuses the attention of our school communities at a time in world history when positively managing change is a significant challenge. As Br Patrick Lynch, Chief Executive of the New Zealand Catholic Education Office points out: "Standing still is not a realistic option if we are to be faithful to the Gospel." Catholic Schools in New Zealand are up to 150 years old, but can trace their origins back to the first Benedictine Monasteries, which commenced educating in Europe in 530AD. The first free schools for the children of ordinary citizens were opened in France in 1681 by St Jean Baptiste de la Salle, the Patron Saint of Teachers, who also opened the world's first Training College. There are 66,000 students in Catholic schools in New Zealand at present, but former students of Catholic schools worldwide number in the hundreds of millions, and many are in prominent leadership positions in a wide range of communities. We have great potential to "be the change we would like to see in this world", and that applies to every single student at Sacred Heart today.

We have had a great start to Term 2! Senior students will be very much aware that the really hard work for NCEA is done throughout Terms 2 and 3.

Some students are already preparing for Scholarship examinations. I take this opportunity to commend them for setting high goals and for seeking to achieve the best possible results. I also take the opportunity to thank them and their teachers for the additional hours of study, commitment to answering/marking questions and using all the higher order thinking skills to explore and come to new understandings.

This week I spoke to some Year 11 students about how they were getting on with their preparations for Assessment Week. Clearly some students are studying well, have sound study plans and are on target. Others still need some assistance. All Year 11 students were given a study guide at the start of the year to help with their time management. The booklet also contains a variety of study skill techniques which will assist them through to the end of the year.

However, this message is relevant for all our students to live up to our school motto 'Age Quod Agis', "What ever you do, do to the best of your ability".

<b>Years 11-13 -</b>	Assessment Week is scheduled for Monday 31st May until Friday 4th June.

Please encourage your daughter to approach these assessments well prepared by:

- Ensuring that she does a minimum of 2-3 hours of school work per night and 4-5 hours in the weekend.

- Check she is not too distracted from school work by part-time employment, her social life or technology pasttimes;
- Checking her assessment schedule
- Liaising with her teachers if you have any concerns.

It is important that all students are conscientious in their efforts to learn, to achieve with excellence, and to accomplish or surpass the goals set at the beginning of the year.

Open Day on Wednesday May 5<sup>th</sup> provided an opportunity for many from the wider community to come to the College. Our aim was to show the College in action and display the wide range of activities and programmes available to students. We were very proud of our Senior Leaders and our Year 12 Aunties who acted as hosts showing people around the College, and of all students who so willingly involved themselves in the many and varied activities during the day. Feedback from the many visitors commented positively on the girls' friendly manner, knowledge and helpfulness. A big thank you to all involved.

It is pleasing to see students focused on academic pursuits and many have participated in a range of education outside the classroom activities. This term many have also participated in: The Sheilah Winn Shakespeare Competitions, Pasifika by Nature, the Vocal Students Concert, the St John's and Sacred Heart Combined Band. 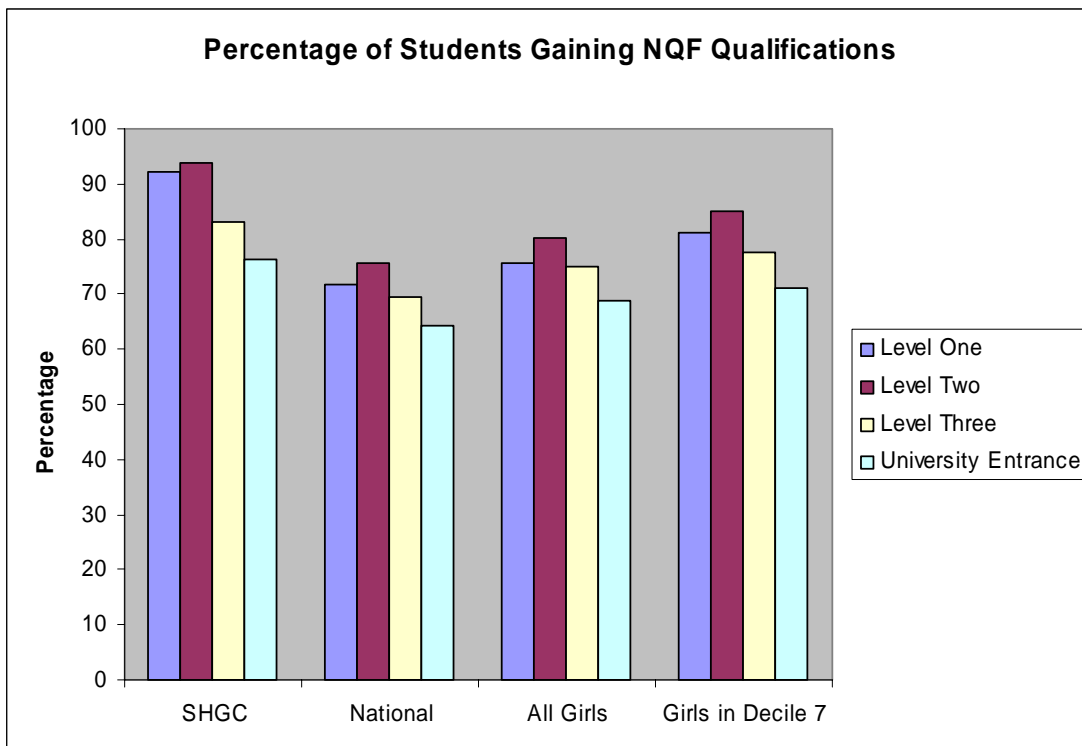

**ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**

The overall NCEA data has now been finalised and published. Sacred Heart Girls' College is very proud of the results achieved by our students. The following graph show that at all levels in last year's NCEA assessments, students at Sacred Heart Girls' College performed at a higher level than students nationally, girls nationally and girls in Decile 7 schools.

**ASSESSMENT WEEK AND MID-YEAR REPORTS**

Week Seven of Term Two (31st May—4th June) is set down as Assessment Week. During this week students in Year 11, 12 and 13 will have assessments in a number of their subjects. It is most important that students be present for all assessments. With some internal assessments this may be the final opportunity students have to gain the credits while the grades they get in their practice assessments may be required as evidence if your daughter needs to apply for a derived grade due to unforeseen circumstances at the time of their external exams.

Mid year reports will be sent out during Week Six of Term Two (24th—28th May) for Junior students and at the end of the term for Senior students.

**NCEA - National Certificate of Educational Achievement**

Students will be entered for NCEA, Scholarship and the Cambridge Examinations through the school. There is no need for parents or students to make entries.

Fees are due in August and an invoice will be sent out to the parents/caregivers of each candidate. If you do not pay the \$75 fee for New Zealand residents or the \$375 if you are a fee-paying student, then you will not receive your results or any Certificates the following year. Some families are eligible for reduced fees if there are multiple entries from the same family (even if the candidates are at different schools). Many are also eligible for assistance if there is financial hardship in the household.

**Criteria for Financial Assistance**

To apply for financial assistance, the applicant (normally the parent/caregiver of the Candidate) must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Be receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit
- Have a joint family income that would entitle the applicant to receive a Community Services card
- Have more than one child who are candidates in the same year and their total fees would amount to more than \$200.

If you think you are eligible for financial assistance you must complete the Financial Assistance form that can be found on the NZQA website ([www.nzqa.govt.nz](http://www.nzqa.govt.nz)) or ask your daughter to get a copy from Mrs Jackson at school. This form must be completed and returned to the school by the beginning of September.

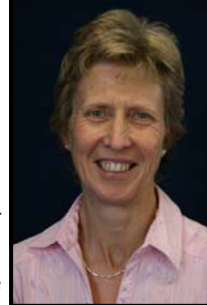

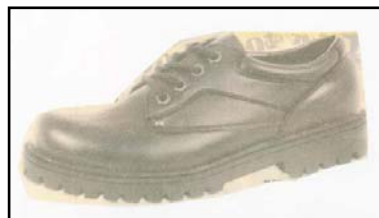
**LATES**

## GATEWAY NEWS



The 2010 Gateway programme is full steam ahead in Term 2. We now have 31 students participating in the Programme this year undergoing a huge variety of work placements. Term 1 was spent looking at different career ideas and researching jobs through the DreamCatcher programme and through discussing their career choices with those already in their industries of interest.

Over half the students enrolled on the Gateway Programme have started their gateway placements and all have embarked on industry specific study. All of the Gateway students have now undergone workplace safety training and most have achieved a First Aid Certificate.

This year the studied areas are even more varied than previously. We have students in primary teaching, event management, several different areas of equine study are being explored, early childhood education, the armed forces, hairdressing, politics, law, social work, animal care, tourism, occupational therapy, nursing, midwifery, administration, hospitality, farming, accounting, television, camera work and print graphics.

We really appreciate all the support we have had from local schools and business. Students have been placed with the National MP David Bennett, the Waikato Hospital, Jubilee ECE, The Grey Street Kitchen, the Hyatt Kingsgate Hotel, Marian, Pukerau and St Joseph's (Morrinsville) Primary Schools, Berkley Middle School, Te Ahurei A Rangitahi, NZ Equine Training School, Joanne Andrew, Equine Chiropractor and the Hamilton City Cadet Unit.
